# Safe people and operations

Some of the work we do around **Safe** people and operations that relate to the Cruise industry includes:

- Maintaining Rescue Coordination capability to respond to small or large incidents.
- Supporting safe navigation of cruise vessels, working with Regional Councils across NZ.

Example: Advise and provide assurance to Ministers / others that good navigational safety controls and other protections are in place in Milford Sound to support ongoing safe operation of cruise.

- Undertake the workplace health and safety role on ports to support safe berthing and disembarking of passengers.
- Carry out Port State control inspections supporting Cruise companies to operate safe vessels to NZ.



# Secure ports and ships

Some of Maritime NZ's **Secure** actions that relate to the Cruise industry are:

- Trial of an identification medallion for cruise passengers disembarking at NZ Ports = efficient movement of passengers so they can make the most of visits.
- Support Ports to have fit-for-purpose security plans that provide for a secure disembarking environment = Cruise passengers experience is safe and un-hampered.
- Support cruise companies and ports to run security exercises while vessels are in ports to ensure where incidents occur there are effective response plans.



# Clean Seas and Waterways

Some of Maritime NZ's **Clean** actions that relate to the Cruise industry are:

- Maintaining a capable oil spill preparedness and response function.
- Efficient Implementation of MARPOL Annex VI.
- Ensuring national discussions on emission reduction efforts include the Maritime sector to support access to green fuels for ships coming to New Zealand.
- Through the IMO:
  - Advocating for a globally consistent, outcome based approach to managing pollutants and emissions.
  - Active engagement in international negotiations on greenhouse gas emissions reduction, air emissions, ballast water management, marine plastic litter, and noise



# Sustainable Supply Chains and Sectors

Some of Maritime NZ's **Sustainable** actions that relate to the Cruise industry are:

- Improving the Maritime Rules framework to achieve better outcomes and reduce regulatory burden where appropriate, including enabling innovation.
- Supporting understanding of the impact of policies on maritime matters and supply chains, including the cruise sector (often with MBIE).
- Influencing sustainable future operation of cruise in NZ

Role played between the cruise sector and other agencies / government to enable safe and efficient re-opening of the border to cruise after COVID.
